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Accomplished Bay Area Tutor Chris Norwood Looking to Make His Mark on Milpitas School Board

In the spring of 2012, eight-year-old John I. Norwood made history in Milpitas as a John Sinnott Elementary School second-grader by scoring a perfect 1200 on the California Standards Tests (CST). On what is also known as the STAR Test, John scored 600 on both Math and English Language Arts tests—an achievement that seasoned school administrators had not recalled ever having been accomplished within the Milpitas school system. News spread around the Bay Area and beyond about an African American student who defied the odds. Now, two and a half years later, John's father (and tutor), Chris Norwood endeavors to make his own mark on Milpitas education after winning a seat on the Milpitas Unified School District Board of Education.

Three seats on the board are up for election on November 4, 2014. Norwood possesses more than twenty years experience working with Milpitas schools and the school district as a coach, tutor, mentor, volunteer, guest speaker and service provider. The board member aspirer, who labels himself 'The Future is Now" candidate, has garnered support and public endorsements from an impressive list of education professionals, community leaders and elected officials from throughout Santa Clara County.

Norwood has very clearly outlined key priorities for when he is elected to the Milpitas Unified School District Board of Education. He espouses to continually advocate for:

- All students shall be academically competitive and prepared for 21st century career opportunities.
- Building academic and cultural bridges between and among campuses, communities and commerce.
- Persistently encouraging, equipping and empowering our teachers to be among the nation's best.

"The businesses that drive the Bay Area economy require ever-growing technology skills. The public education system's adoption of Common Core State Standards and the recent implementation of the Local Control Funding Formula require that the Milpitas School Board encompass representatives who are motivated, experienced and possess community leadership qualities," said Norwood. "I am a 41 year resident of Milpitas. The city has helped me become a winner in the game of life. I am excited about the opportunity to share my educational and leadership experience within the community in which I grew up and was educated.

Milpitas, CA and its School District

Earlier this month, *Money Magazine* named Milpitas among the top 50 small cities with populations between 50,000 and 300,000. It was one of only three cities in California to make the list. Milpitas ranked 29, behind Irvine (14) and ahead of Pleasanton (31), out of a pool of 781 cities. Milpitas is a fast growing city whose current population is listed near 70,000. Nestled next to San Jose, Milpitas has been called the gateway to Silicon Valley. It is the 10th largest city in the U.S. The Milpitas Unified School District encompasses nine elementary schools, two middle schools, one high school and one continuation school. Milpitas High School ranks 176th in the state and 867th nationally.
